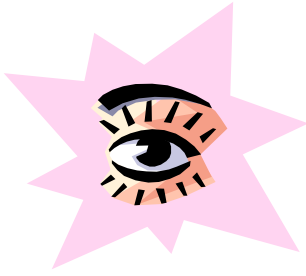

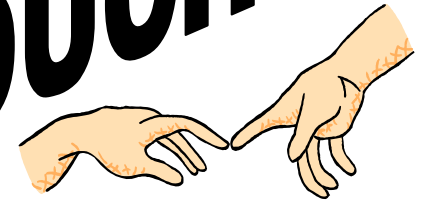

Visual Learners:

See

Visual learners learn best by looking at graphics, watching a demonstration or reading.

For them, it's easy to look at charts and graphs, but they may have difficulty focusing while listening to an explanation.

Auditory Learners:

Hear

Auditory learners would rather listen to things being explained than read about them.

Reciting information out loud and having music in the background may be a common study method.

Other noises may become a distraction resulting in a need for a relatively quiet place.

Kinesthetic Learners:

Touch

Kinesthetic learners process information best through a "hands-on" experience.

Actually doing an activity can be the easiest way for them to learn.

Sitting still while studying may be difficult, but writing things down makes it easier to understand.
